Regards: Infectuous Disease Outbreak

In the last days there have been increased reports of an infectuous disease outbreak within the Greater Khelson Bay Area that seems to induce aggressive behavior and intense aggression, resulting in several reports to the police for battery and assault.

With the infectuous disease outbreak going on, it is recommended to stay at home unless otherwise necessitated. For the general protection, the USPHSCC has offered a program of distribution for surgical masks for free. To receive your mask package, bring your ID and SSN to the hospital parking area, looking for a temporary service area set up by the Public Health Service.

We expect additional information to be provided by the Surgeon General in the coming weeks and urge to practice caution and circumspect behavior until then.

If you do come into contact with any <u>uncoordinated</u> and <u>hyper-aggressive</u> fellow citizen, step back from the situation and disengage, informing police and the USPHSCC official, currently quartered in the Michelle Hulls Memorial Hospital and reachable via telephone (503-971-4027) or E-Mail (hector.cardona@usphs.gov). If you find yourself attacked, do not hesitate to call the police.

After any altercation with potential infected persons, it is required to inform the local hospital (see above for contact information) and recommended that you quarantine yourself at home or inform the hospital so you can be quarantined on-site under the care of capable doctors.

We ask any citizens to act sensibly in this trying time and remember the lessons learned during the Corona Pandemic.
