Date:16th March 2024From:Oregon State Police, United States Public Health ServiceTo:Citizens of the Greater Khelson Bay AreaRegards:VT-4 Outbreak Quarantine Regulations

Quarantine has started on the 14th of March in accordance with the General Surgeon's speech on television, as well as the report in all newspapers large and small. Quarantine regulars have been published and starting today will be enforced in a stricter fashion.

Legitimate reasons to be breaking quarantine are enumerated as follows:

- Purchase of necessary goods (food, hygiene products, medical goods)
- Medical Emergencies
- Familial Emergencies

Other reasons are to be determined by police officers to be legitimate or not, following a strict quarantine guidebook. Any breaking of quarantine outside of these legitimate reasons will lead to detainment and legal consequences up to full imprisonment to a maximum of ten years jail time.

The helpline is available for questions about the disease known as VT-4, quarantine procedures as well as directing citizens to local help organizations to supply food and hygiene products as required.

For the purpose of maintaining the quarantine, public services have been deputized. Treat the following services as deputized police officers until further notice:

- Khelson Bay Fire & Rescue
- Khelson Bay EMT Services
